Cedarville High School will rebuild its girls and boys basketball programs for the 2009-2010 season. The Trojans girls team, coached by Sonja Duncan, has just two players returning. The boys squad, with Dave Duncan coaching, has four players coming back this season to build the Cedarville program.

Last season, the teams both won Eastern Upper Peninsula Conference, Class D district, and regional championships. After losing some outstanding players to graduation, the Trojans programs will play tough during the upcoming season.

Trojans Girls Return Two Players

Coach Sonja Duncan, in her fourth season on the bench at her alma mater, has two players returning and seven athletes joining the team. The team lost athletes Jessica Duncan, Billie McLeod, Ashley Sweeney, Kacie Simpson, and Karley Smith to graduation.

Third-year senior Jillian Collins (guard) will have the responsibility to lead this young Trojans squad, along with Hope Wittmus (forward/ center) in her second year.

Coach Dave Duncan To Earn 300th Win

In the early part of the 2009-2010 schedule, it is anticipated that Coach Dave Duncan will record his 300th win. Coach Duncan has compiled a 299-150 overall record for a 66.5 winning percentage and averaged 16 wins each year in his 19 years as a coach.

Cedarville Boys Register 100-6 Record in Four Years

Coach Dave Duncan will rebuild the Trojans after four consecutive final-four appearances and a 100-6 overall record that includes one state championship, one state runner-up, two semifinal contests, and four Eastern Upper Peninsula Conference (EUPC) titles.

Athletes C.J. Paquin, Luke Murray, Taylor Smith, James Mitchell, Scott McGreevy, and Alex McMaken were graduated

last season.

Even so, the Trojans' cupboards are not bare, as seniors Andrew Jaroche (guard), Zach McFarlane (guard/forward), and Trent Pitko (guard) will return for their final season, along with second-year junior Jordan Baker (guard/forward). Junior Connor McLeod (center) was moved up to the varsity from the junior varsity level late in the season last year.

First-year players are juniors Tyler Kanitz (guard/forward),

Matthew Schlosser (guard), Jeremy Sherlund (guard), Jake Strait (forward), Michael Kenny (forward), and Mitchell Fultz (forward/center).

Assistant coaches are Kurt Duncan and Scott Barr.

Cedarville will battle for the EUPC title with Pickford, Brimley, DeTour, and Engadine and enjoy non-league contests against Rudyard, St. Ignace, Harbor Springs, Posen, Boyne City, Flint Academy, and Harbor Light Christian.
