Lady Saints Rebuilding Toward 8th District Crown

Coach Dorene Ingalls, in her eighth season, will be facing a rebuilding process after losing five quality seniors who started throughout the season.

Krista LaVake, senior guard,

started at times during the 2004 season, with guard Jenny Massaway, who had her junior season cut short by an injury and is looking forward to her final season at LHS.

"Krista and Jenny have nagging injuries that will make them questionable for the start of the season," Coach Ingalls said.

our speed and quickness is a big plus along with the strong work ethics," Coach Ingalls said.

The Saints open their season defending their title at the Petoskey Tourney along with the host Northmen, Harbor Springs, and Benzie Central. The remaining non-league schedule includes Escanaba, Cedarville, Pickford, and Gaylord, while SAC opponents include Newberry, Rudyard, Sault High, Cheboygan, and Rogers City.
