TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:

On our about June 10, 2006, the above-named Brevort Township, Mackinac County, will request the State of Michigan to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (P.L. 93-383) for the following project:

Downtown Moran Commercial District Improvement, consisting of Removal of Abandoned Building, Replacement with Paved Parking Lot in Highway M-123, Brevort Township, Mackinac County, Michigan. Estimated Cost of Project: \$47,095

Finding of No Significant Impact

It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment, and accordingly the above-named Brevort Township has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (P.L. 91-190).

The reasons for such decision not to prepare an EIS are as follows:

1. The location does not sit on a flood plain or wetlands area.
2. The project does not involve the discharge of wastewaters into or onto the ground.
3. The project does not involve any work (dredging, filling, draining, construction) proposed in, across, or under (a) rivers, streams, creeks, ditches, drains, lakes, ponds or swamps; (b) wetlands; or (c) floodplain.
4. The property and project do not pose any environmental problems as determined by the four-step Environmental Review process required for application for project funds.

An Environmental Review Record respecting the proposed project has been made by the above-named Brevort Township, which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why an EIS is not required. This Environmental Review Records is on file at the Brevort Township Library in the Community Center and is available for review Monday and Wednesday from 9am-2pm and Tuesday and Thursday from 3pm-8pm. No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of federal funds.

Public Comments on Finding

All interested agencies, groups, and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by Township of Brevort to the Office of the Undersigned on or before June 9, 2006. All such comments so received will be considered, and the Township of Brevort will not request the release of federal funds or take any administrative action on the proposed project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.

Release of Funds

Brevort Township will undertake the project described above with Community Development Block Grant funds from the State of Michigan under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. Brevort Township is certifying to the State of Michigan that Brevort Township and Ed Serwach, in his official capacity as Township Supervisor, consent to accept the jurisdiction of the federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental reviews, decision-making, and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its approval, Brevort Township may use the Block Grant funds, and the state will have satisfied its responsibilities to the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969.

Objections to State Release of Funds

The State of Michigan will accept an objection to its approval only if it is on one of the following bases: (a) that the certification was not in fact executed by the certifying officer or other officer of applicant approved by the State of Michigan; or (b) that applicant's environmental review record for the project indicated omission of a required decision finding or step applicable to the project in the environmental review process. Objections must be prepared and submitted to the State of Michigan, Michigan State Housing Development Authority, Community Assistance Team, 735 East Michigan Avenue, Post Office Box 30044, Lansing, Michigan 48909.

Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by the state. No objections received after June 26, 2006, will be considered by the state.

Nine students, including Chad Schlosser, Ryan Duman, Lauren Izzard, Matthew Manley, Jill Haske, Jeannine McGreevy, Barbara Gay, Bradley Lanpher, and Henry Smith, qualified for the Eastern Upper Peninsula Principals Awards banquet in April at the Sault Country Club in Sault

Ste. Marie. In addition to being recognized for their achievements, the students were able to hear student speakers Janelle Klamerus of DeTour and Jack Roberts, executive director of the Michigan High School Athletic Association.

Mr. Schaedig clarified that the \$10 examination fees charged to students during the annual sports physical event April 30 were charged by the physicians performing the examinations. The Trojan Booster Club was not charging the students. Physicians chose to donate the money back to the Trojan Booster Club as a fundraiser for the club.

In other news, Mr. Schaedig reported that this year's prom, held at Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island, was a success, and commended student organizers Rebecca Bickham and Kristen Duman for their work on the event. Students who participated met in St. Ignace, rode the ferry to the island, took a carriage to Grand Hotel, and danced most of the

night until a specially scheduled ferry returned them to the mainland. Students were back to Cedarville before midnight, and they had to sign in at the school to

prove they had returned. Mr. Schaedig said he was pleased with the uniqueness of the event and the responsibility of the students who participated.

Trojan Basketball Camp To Begin June 5

Cedarville Trojan basketball camp is slated to begin again Monday, June 5, and continue through Friday, June 9. Anyone who wants to participate in the camp must register by Thursday, June 1.

The camp is designed for student athletes who will be in grades four through 12 at the beginning of next school year. To qualify, the household income cannot exceed \$35,000. The applicant must also be 62 years of age or older, including the unmarried surviving spouse of a person who is 62 years of age or older at the time of death, paraplegic, quadriplegic, eligible serviceperson, veteran, widow or widower, blind or totally and permanently disabled.

Those that farm agricultural real property may also qualify.
