There will be a commodities food distribution in the Eastern Upper Peninsula Wednesday, June 14, to Friday, June 16. Commodities to be distributed are apple juice, beef stew, canned chicken, cling peaches, grape juice, instant potatoes, mixed fruit, peas, spaghetti, spaghetti sauce, and sweet potatoes. Persons receiving commodities must present a blue food card. Food will be distributed on a first come, first serve basis, on the following schedule:



 Ideas are being accepted for a graphic design for Michigan's new license plate to replace the current plate depicting the Mackinac Bridge, announced Secretary of State Terri Lynn Land Tuesday, May 30.
 The deadline for submissions is midnight Friday, June 23. Entry forms are available at all Secretary of State branch offices or online at www.Michigan.gov/sos.
 New sales of the Mackinac Bridge plate will cease next year, but motorists who already have the plate may continue renewing it. It is available as an alternative to Michigan's standard plate for an additional \$5.
