## Bulldogs Blank Harbor Springs

Rudyard scored on its first possession and never looked back as the Bulldogs shut out Harbor Springs 20-0 Friday, August 25.

"I was pleased with the outcome, especially the defense getting the shut out," said Bulldogs Coach Pat Maloney.

Owen McGrath led the Black and Orange defense with 10 tackles and one fumble recovery. Brady Burby added eight stops, Marcus Chantos chipped in seven, Lee Stevens notched six, James Perry tallied five, Jeff Briggs charted four with one sack and one fumble recovery, Dan Bartley counted four, John Manitowabi marked three with one sack, and Pete Lawlor registered two tackles, one interception, and one fumble recovery.

David Kelly led the balanced ground game for the Bulldogs with 70 yards. Perry added 59, Lawlor chipped in 57 rushing yards and one reception for five yards, McGrath notched 55 rushing yards and completed two of nine passes for 41 yards, Dan Bartley caught

one pass for 36 yards. Burby tallied 23 yards, and Robert McKerchie charted 22 yards.

Burby scored from one yard out for the Bulldogs' first touchdown of the season on the opening drive and Jeff Briggs kicked the extra point for a 7-0 lead.

Lawlor, on defense, intercepted the Rams pass and dashed 46 yards for the score and Briggs chipped in his second extra point kick as the Bulldogs increased the lead to 14-0 at halftime.

Rudyard extended the lead to 20-0 in the third quarter after Kelly rambled 50 yards for the Bulldogs final touchdown while the defense kept the Rams out of the endzone.

The Bulldogs will play the second of four road games with a non-conference contest at Elk Rapids Thursday, August 31.

## Engadine Drops MEFC Football Opener to Mid-Peninsula, 31-12

Engadine and Mid Peninsula battled tooth and nail for 45 of the 48 minutes before the Wolverines took control with two late touchdowns and downed the Eagles 31-12 Friday, August 25.

"I felt we played well at times, but overall it was a good team effort," said Eagles Coach Howard Hood. "We have some injuries to key veteran players and that has made the coaching staff play some younger players."

Grayson Hood led the Eagles offense with 115 yards on 28 carries. Stefan Albright added 57 rushing yards and completed two of four passes for 24 yards, Sung Hart notched 22 yards, Dylan Duflo chipped in 16 yards, and David

Derusha caught the two passes for 24 yards.

On the defensive side of the football, Derusha and Hood led the Eagles with six tackles, Duflo added five with one fumble recovery, Chris Keller chipped in five, Ron Weger and Michael Mast tallied four, and Hart charted two with one fumble recovery.

After a scoreless first quarter, Sung Hart recovered the Wolverines fumble that set up the Grayson Hood one-yard touchdown at the 11:06 mark, for a 6-0 lead.

The visitors from Mid Peninsula scored consecutive touchdowns in the second quarter for a 12-6 halftime advantage. With 2:10 left in the third quarter, the Wolverines
