Cancer survivors Barb Demeuse and Judy Brazeau, both of Gladstone, traveled to Mrs. Brazeau's hometown of St. Ignace to participate in the July 28 and 29 Relay for Life. The two women are part of a three-person team that includes Kristen Sandstrom of Gladstone and raised more than \$10,000 this year for Relay for Life, almost half of the \$22,500 raised in Delta County, where the women live.
