

Eagles, Panthers Close out Season on Positive Note

Engadine closed out the season on a successful note with a 22-14 Mid-Eastern Football Conference win over Brimley Friday, October 20.

"The team played hard in this game and all season, and never gave up," said Eagles Coach Howard Hood. "We have had some injuries, and with low numbers, that was a factor during the season."

The Eagles, 2-7 on the season and 2-6 in the MEFC, scored first as Stefan Albright hooked up with David Derusha on a 19-yard touchdown pass and Joel VanHise added the two-point conversion for an 8-0 lead at the 4:15 mark of the first quarter.

Early in the second quarter (11:42) Jerrod Dillon answered for the Bays with a 27-yard run and Jordan Dillon completed the two-point conversion pass to Frankie St. George to tie the half-time score at 8.

Senior fullback Dylan Duflo dashed up the middle for a 91-yard touchdown with 6:28 remaining in the third quarter, for a 14-8 advantage.

Linebacker Grayson Hood closed out the scoring for the Eagles at 3:48 of the final period with a pass interception and the senior returned the pigskin 28 yards to give Engadine a 22-8

margin.

Brimley scored with 1:53 left in the game and attempted an outside kick, but Michael Mast recovered the ball for the Eagles and Engadine ran out the clock.

Feltner Receives Historic Preservation Award

Dr. Charles Feltner of DeTour Village has received the Association for Great Lakes Maritime History's 2006 Award for Historic Preservation for his work to preserve the DeTour Reef Light.

Dr. Feltner has served on the DeTour Reef Light Preservation Society for the past eight years in various roles. As Restoration Committee chair, Dr. Feltner personally supervised the interior and exterior restoration of the DeTour Reef Light. In addition to supervising the restoration project, Dr. Feltner has accumulated and digitized more than 10,000 pages of historical docu-

ments, drawings, and photographs of the project.

The lighthouse stands one mile offshore in northern Lake Huron, between DeTour Village and Drummond Island. It once helped guide ship traffic to and from Lake Huron and Lake Superior via the St. Marys River.

The Association for Great Lakes Maritime History is a regional association of more than 100 museums and historical societies whose award program recognizes individuals who have made major contributions to the preservation and interpretation of that history.
