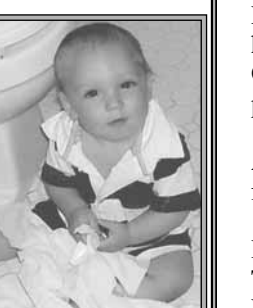

Christine Ney Earns Education Award

Christine Ney, formerly of St. Ignace, an instructor at Ball State University, has earned an award from *The Indianapolis Star* Academic All-Stars Program, sponsored in conjunction with the Indiana Association of School Principals and the Indiana Department of Education.

There were 228 students throughout Indiana nominated as Academic All-Stars, with 40 of them becoming finalists. Jane Ren, the finalist from the Indiana Academy for Science, Mathematics and Humanities, recognized her teacher, Ms. Ney, as the teacher who most influenced her academic career. Both were honored and received plaques at a banquet for the 40 All-Stars and their teachers in the ballroom of the Indiana Repertory Theater in Indianapolis in April.

Ms. Ney is the daughter of Peter and Mary Ney of St. Ignace and Palm Desert, California. The Christine Ney Fund for Theater Arts and Humanities has been established by Eben Hewitt and Allison Brown so that needy students would be able to participate in English Department field trips to the Stratford, Ontario, Festival Theater productions. Mr. Hewitt, a former student of Ms. Ney's at Ball State University's Burriss High School, was introduced to the Stratford productions through Ms. Ney's school-sponsored trips there.

Ms. Ney has been sponsoring student trips to Stratford since 1973. "In the course of my teaching, I always try to enable my students to experience the literature we study through field trips," she said. "Obviously, I believe in the educational value of 'being there.' I'm always concerned, though, about the students who can't afford to go on these trips. It was one of these students a long time ago. What Eben Hewitt and Allison Brown did in creating this foundation is a wonderful act of generosity that I hope will be appreciated and experienced by many students to come."

Ms. Ney and her students visited St. Ignace and the Straits area in May 2006. For most students, the St. Ignace trip offered their first opportunities to eat pasties and smoked whitefish. These students were also "smudged" in a Native American cleansing ceremony by Ms. Ney's Ojibwe cousin, Tony Grondin of St. Ignace, in the Ojibwe lodge in the Pere Marquette Park.

"Students were amazed at the friendliness and hospitality of the St. Ignace people," Ms. Ney said. Contributions to the Christine Ney Fund for Theater Arts and Humanities may be sent to Indiana Academy, University Development, Ball State University, Muncie, IN 47306-0082.

'Face in the Rock' Book Focus of Bayliss Program

Author Loren Graham will visit Bayliss Public Library in Sault Ste. Marie to speak about his book "A Face in the Rock: The Tale of a Grand Island Chippewa" Thursday, July 19, at 7 p.m. The event is free and open to the public.

In 2000, Mr. Graham received the Folio Award from the Historical Society of Michigan for his contributions to the history of the U.P.

Mr. Graham is professor emeritus of the History of Science at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and summers on Grand Island in Lake Superior. His book, "A Face in the Rock," published in 1995, was the result of a 40-year effort to research family legend and written documents. The story is about Powers of the Air, a Grand Island Chippewa who witnessed the death of the men of his tribe in a battle with the Sioux, and told the story of Governor Lewis Cass and Henry Schoolcraft on their visit to the area in 1820. A French trapper commemorated the occasion by carving the face of Powers of the Air in a nearby cliff. Later, Powers of the Air was the inspiration for Longfellow's poem of Hiawatha.

Mr. Graham's book is being made into a movie using local actors. Bayliss Library will host the premiere showing of the film trailer July 19. The filmmakers will be on hand to share their ideas for the development of the film.
