## Court Reports

The following dispositions are from 92nd District Court in St. Ignace Tuesday, December 4, and Wednesday, December 5, Judge Beth Gibson presiding. Arresting agencies are in parentheses. The court does not distinguish between jail time to be served immediately and jail sentences that are suspended.  
 •Lindy Green, 45, of Moran, pleaded guilty to driving while license suspended, and was assessed a fine of \$500 or 50 days in jail. (St. Ignace City Police)  
 •Miriam Blair, 57, of St. Ignace, was found guilty by jury to operating while visibly impaired, and was

assessed a fine of \$1,915.44, 93 days in jail, 12 months probation, and an ignition interlock device on her vehicle for 60 days. (St. Ignace City Police)  
 •Michael Krull, 49, of Sault Ste. Marie, pleaded no contest to receiving and concealing stolen property of \$200 to \$1,000, was assessed a fine of \$250, and must pay \$229 in restitution. (Michigan State Police)
