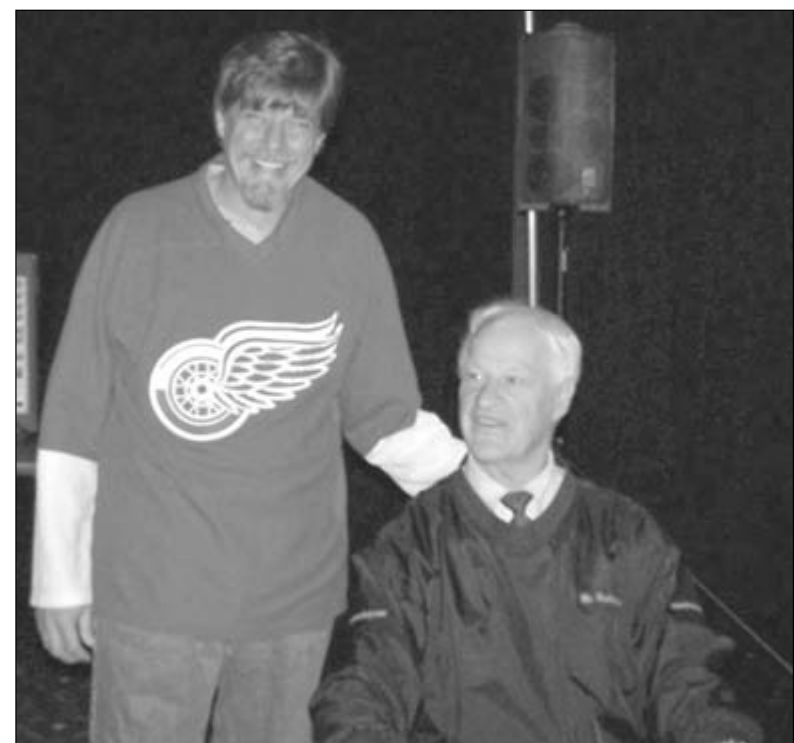

Two opportunities for restaurant managers to attend a 16-hour ServSafe Manager Certificate Course will be offered Tuesdays, May 20 and May 27, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at Little Bear East Conference Center in St. Ignace. Managers will also be able to take the ServSafe Food Protection Manager Certification Examination. All food establishments must employ a manager who has been certified by an accredited food safety program by June 30, 2009.

Michigan State University Extension is offering the training.

Registration fee is \$220 and payments must be received by April 30.

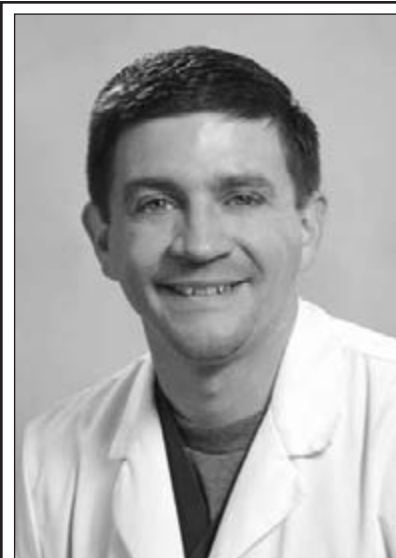
