from 1933 to 1955, is in the center of the museum's large exhibit hall. The display includes original copies of the magazine, and some of the press plates used to print the art that appeared on its pages.

A school display with school-books, a typewriter owned by a former teacher, a slate, and other items has been established in the log cabin part of the museum. Visitors can move clockwise from that display around to a living room display of home artifacts, including a family cradle and loom. A church exhibit follows, and contains antique items from local churches. An exhibit about the former Pleasant View Laundry, a business owned and operated by the Axel Shoberg family, features photographs and antique washing equipment from the business.

Other new exhibits include one about Les Cheneaux Islands cottagers, and a kitchen and dining room display, with rotating china place settings. Museum worker Mary Hill said the Historical Association would like to feature a different set of china every year. This year's featured set is a Currier and Ives pattern loaned by Cynthia Smith.

Familiar exhibits that remain the same include a geology of the Les Cheneaux Islands display, an Oliver Birge exhibit, and a logging exhibit that was raised higher for better visibility.

This year's raffle quilt is queen-sized, machine pieced, and hand-quilted in an "Up North Forest" theme, and can be seen at the museum. The quilt was stitched by

at least 10 volunteers, who worked on the quilt through the winter. The quilt is the grand prize in the raffle, and two more tickets will be drawn to award second and third place prizes. Tickets are \$2 each, and are sold at the Historical and

Maritime museums, and local businesses, including First National Bank in Cedarville. Proceeds support Historical Association activities like concerts and the "Artist of the Week" summer artist series, which starts this week. Weekly artist talks and demonstrations are from noon to 3 p.m. on the lawn of the Historical Museum.

Griz and Friends will perform Ballads of the Great Lakes Wednesday, July 2, at 7 p.m., at the Maritime Museum on M-134 and Lake Street, just east of Cedarville. Stilt-walker Completes Fund-raising Journey

Sauter Raised More Than \$64,000 for Cerebral Palsy

Stilt-walker Neil Sauter raised more than \$16,000 for United Cerebral Palsy during his walk across Michigan in June. At the Wisconsin border in Ironwood Friday, June 27, Mr. Sauter, who has mild cerebral palsy, completed his 830-mile journey spanning the upper and lower peninsulas. While passing through the Straits area, Mr. Sauter walked across the front porch at Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island Saturday, June 7, and talked to St. Ignace residents at the St. Ignace Middle School Monday, June 9.

Mr. Sauter went through three pairs of stilts and took eight weeks to complete the journey.

"Wind, rain, busy roads, broken stilts, and eight falls have not dampened Neil's spirit," said Linda Potter, United Cerebral Palsy (UCP) of Michigan executive director. "His perseverance and dedication mean so much to UCP and the people who

will be helped by the funds he raised."

Many communities along his route welcomed Mr. Sauter and offered free food, free lodging, and other help. He has also spoken at more than a dozen schools.

"The generosity of everyone I've met on the trip has been overwhelming," said Mr. Sauter, who raised more than \$64,000 in total for UCP through a 3-1 matching grant from the U.S. Department of Education. "I've worked to give back to the disability community that has supported me, and each place I've visited has kept giving."

After expenses, all donated funds will support a program providing loans for communications tools, mobility aids, and accessible home modifications for people with disabilities.

Cerebral palsy is the most widespread lifetime disability in the United States. More than 35,000 people in Michigan have cerebral palsy.
