

Olsen, Visnaw Win Individual Golf Titles

Brian Olsen (154) won his first title and Ruth Visnaw (174) captured her third crown during St. Ignace Golf Club championships Saturday, August 16, and Sunday, August 17.

Olsen, from the championship flight, and Jo Jo Visnaw, from the first flight, tied for first place with a 36-hole score of 154 before Olsen won the championship on hole two, par three in the sudden death match.

Matt Mortensen placed second with a score of 155 and Lou Grondin took third with 146, while Jane Perry recorded 184 to finish second, and Fay Massey finished third with 184 in the championship flight for the men and women.

Jo Visnaw won the first flight with a score of 154, Jesse Pemble was second at 158, and Bob Sweeney was third with 160.

Mike Bishop took first in the second flight with 163, Bob Brandstrom second at 165, and Kyle O'Boyle third at 166.

Victor Matson finished first in the third flight with a score of 172. Chris Levi placed second at 179, and Joe Krause third at 180.

Russ Caskey placed first in the fourth flight at 187, Josh Zike second at 191, and Steve Stokes third at 193.

Crews Will Survey Pine River for Sea Lampreys

A U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service assessment crew will conduct work in the Pine River in Mackinac County Tuesday, August 19, through Tuesday, August 26, to estimate the abundance of sea lampreys. The information gathered will be used to determine the need for sea lamprey control.

A first step in the control of sea lampreys is to survey streams tributary to the Great Lakes to determine the presence of lamprey larvae. Sea lampreys invaded the Great Lakes during the 1920s and have been a permanent, destructive element of the fishery ever since. Sea lampreys attach to fish with a suction cup mouth, rasp a hole through the fish's

scales and skin, and feed on blood and body fluids. The average sea lamprey will destroy up to 40 pounds of fish during its parasitic phase.

Fishery biologists and technicians conduct surveys for sea lamprey larvae in hundreds of Great Lakes streams each year. Most surveys are conducted by electrofishing, but in deep waters crews use a lampricide approved by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and Health Canada Pest Management Regulatory Agency. This lampricide is specially formulated onto sand granules and covered with a time-release coating. The formulation is sprayed over a measured surface area of water, where it

sinks to the bottom, rapidly dissolves, and causes the larval sea lampreys to leave their burrows and swim to the surface, where they are collected.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and Health Canada Pest Management Regulatory Agency have concluded that the lampricide poses no unreasonable risk to the general population and the environment when applied at concentrations necessary to detect larval sea lampreys. Applications are conducted in accordance with state permits.
